It is published bi-monthly in print and electronically for members of the Institute and subscribers throughout the world. Through an agreement with the National Research Council Press, The Forestry Chronicle is available electronically to all CIF/IFC members and subscribers, online and digital back to 1925. If you wish to have access to the print or electronic format of The Forestry Chronicle, you must complete and submit the [Chronicle Subscription Form](#) with payment.



You are now ready to select the link and connect to the on-line archives of the Forestry Chronicle. After selecting the link you will be redirected to the NRC's page with a list of the current and past editions of the Forestry Chronicle.

The Forestry Chronicle can also be browsed by author, topic, and content. One can enter a list of keywords and the Boolean operators AND, OR, and NOT, together with wildcards (“?”, “*”). For all searches the system performs the search on the meta data and the full text content, and returns a results page with short citation views of the results.

A “Quick Search” can be performed by simply entering the keywords in the search bar in the top right-hand corner of the browser page. Or, alternatively a more Advanced Search can be performed by selecting the tab above the Quick Search option and completing the desired categories (shown below).

The Advanced search allows you to combine a variety of terms (e.g., author, title, date of publication, keyword, subject) to construct a more detailed search of the content. Additional functionality found in the advanced search includes

- Search in publications: restricts the search to particular collections of content, e.g., a particular Journal.
- Search in favourite publications: restricts queries to one (or more) collection(s).
- Search between publication dates.
- Search within results: narrows down a search by executing a new search within the results of the previous search. For example, if a user searched for “blood cells” and found 8981 matches, they could then refine their search within those 8981 results by entering the criterion “red NOT white” in the “Search Within Results” box.

Oh, and don't be worried if you're not sure of the spelling of an author's name. NRC is equipped with “Fuzzy Author Name Search” allowing the search engine to find an author's name even with errors or partial omissions.
